



Accessible Solutions for Online Learning: Considerations for Learners who are B/VI Resources

Federal Quota:

Annually, At the direction of the Ohio Department of Education, Office for Exceptional Children the AT&AEM Center conducts the Federal Quota Registration of Blind Students in Ohio to identify eligible infants, students, and adults who qualify for free textbooks and other hands-on learning materials. SIFTS:

SIFTS is a web-based tool designed to assist assistive technology (AT) decision-making teams in matching a person's needs with AT features. SIFTS is helpful for children through adults and can be used by parents, students, consumers, and professionals serving people with disabilities. Questions about the person's needs and abilities are presented and the answers provided are then used to generate a list of possible AT feature considerations for the team to discuss.

Assistive Technology and Internet Modules:

ATIM is designed to provide high-quality information and professional development on assistive technology (AT) for educators, professionals, families, persons with disabilities, and others. Each module guides you

through AT users' experiences, instructional videos, pre- and post-assessments, a glossary, and much more. ATIM modules are available at no cost.

Where to go for help:

OCALI:

OCALI informs public policy and develops and deploys practices grounded in linking research to real life. Online, free learning opportunities and resources for educators, community members and families.

Ohio State School for the Blind:

The Ohio State School for the Blind provides educational services to students in grades pre-K-12 and also includes a post-secondary program for students who are blind or visually impaired. OSSB serves students throughout the state of Ohio and provides residential services to those families that are too far for daily transportation.

Education happens both inside and outside the classroom at OSSB. With daily classes, Expanded Core Curriculum, Related Services and Athletics, students have a full day of learning. Residential students continue with activities after school hours through the Resident Life program.

State and Regional AT Lending Libraries:

Lending libraries are helpful for people with disabilities to try out different technology based on their needs before purchasing equipment, such as AT, medical equipment or adaptive toys. Many programs offer lending services for free. In 2018 the OCALI AT&AEM Center funded by a grant from the Ohio Developmental Disabilities Council conducted a survey of state and regional AT lending libraries. The information about the lending libraries is provided in multiple downloadable formats as well as an online interactive map.

National AEM Center:

The 2019-2024 National AEM Center provides technical assistance, coaching, and resources to increase the availability and use of accessible educational materials and technologies for learners with disabilities across the lifespan.

AT Ohio:
