Ready, Set, Fair!

Prepare for the Ohio State Fair in 3 Easy Steps

Step 1: Safety

It is important to think about your safety and plan before going to the Ohio State Fair.

- \Box Have a safety plan on how you will ask for help or get help if you need it.
 - Become familiar with the Ohio State Fairgrounds and where to go for help.
 <u>View the Fair Map</u>.
 - Create a plan for what to do if you get separated and review it several times before going. Include a <u>social narrative</u>, <u>communication board</u>, or other visuals with your plan and bring them with you!
- □ If you are supporting someone else, plan for their safety.
 - Make an emergency contact card for the person to carry with them. The <u>American Red Cross</u> offers printable fill-in cards.
 - Stay alert to changes in the environment, such as weather, large crowds, or the person's needs.
- □ Bring essentials like medication, communication tools, sunscreen, sensory items, preferred food/drinks, and an ID card.

Being prepared helps you and others stay safe and enjoy the Ohio State Fair!

Step 2: Attractions

Enjoy rides, games, food, farm animals, and activities – all in one place. With so many attractions, it is important to plan how you will spend your time at the Ohio State Fair.

- Review the Ohio State Fair <u>Daily Schedules</u>, <u>Sensory-Friendly Activities</u>, and <u>Food</u> <u>and Dietary Options</u>.
 - Select the activities you want to do and the foods you like.
 - Add them to a schedule, list, or communication board to bring with you.

- Explore the <u>Ohio State Fair Map</u> or download the Ohio State Fair App and become familiar with where you can find the things you want to do.
- Plan for what to expect at the Fair and what might support you with enjoying the day.
 Read <u>Going to the Ohio State Fair</u> and use the schedule to plan your day.
- Be ready for crowds and waiting for your turn. Bring along a <u>wait cue</u> (i.e. card or object) to support turn-taking.

Planning ahead helps you make the most of your day at the Ohio State Fair!

Step 3: Accessibility

The Ohio State Fair is dedicated to providing a more accessible and welcoming experience for guests of all ages. Consider the supports available as you prepare for your visit.

- Review the <u>Ohio State Fair Accessibility Guide</u> and plan ahead for your Fair experience.
- □ Be sure to consider parking and the spaces that might work best for you to easily enter the Fairgrounds. View the <u>Ohio State Fair Map</u> and Parking Areas marked with the letter P. The Blue Zone includes accessible parking.
- □ Locate the accessible restrooms, available in 13 locations, including one restroom with a universal changing table. View the Ohio State Fair Accessibility Guide, Map or App to find an accessible restroom.
- Need a break? Cool down in the <u>Natural Resource Park</u> located on the Fairgrounds or the Quiet Room in the Voinovich Livestock and Trade Center to reset and reengage with Fair activities.
- Experience the Fair with the lights and sounds lowered by attending the <u>Sensory</u>
 <u>Friendly Morning</u> on July 24, 2025, 10:00 a.m.- 1:00 p.m. Visit the OCALI Tent at the
 Cardinal Gate if you have questions or need help that morning.
