System of Care & Hi-Fidelity Wraparound

System of Care (SOC): <u>NETWORK</u> of services and supports

- Coordinated network of community-based services and supports
- Strengths-based, family/youth-focused, culturally competent
- Systems of Care:
 - Ensure availability of and access to broad array of community-based services and supports that address family needs at all stages of development/transition
 - Develop true partnership with youth and family at all levels – planning, policies, practices
 - Focus on cross-system collaboration, linkages, coordination, and integration
 - Include prevention, identification, and promotion
 - o Incorporate monitoring and accountability

OUTCOMES (Center for Child Welfare)

- Reduced re-referrals to child welfare
- Decline in total days in placement
- Increased permanency
- Improvements in child wellbeing indicators

Hi-Fidelity Wraparound (HFW): Planning PROCESS

- Evidence-based, team planning process
- Four goals of HWF:
 - 1. To meet the needs prioritized by the youth and family
 - 2. To improve the youth/family's ability and confidence to manage their own services and supports
 - 3. To develop or strengthen the youth/family's natural support system over time
 - 4. To integrate the work of all child serving systems and natural supports (ideally SOC) into one streamlined plan
- HFW facilitator guides process
- Facilitator and process focus on NEEDS as expressed and prioritized by youth/family – not services.
- Process results in a plan

OUTCOMES (National Wraparound Initiative)

- Multisystem youth more likely to stay in home
- When out-of-home placement is needed, stay is shorter
- Improved mental health and functioning in homes, schools and communities
- Reduced overall costs
